

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

To this moment, it is estimated that over **18,843,973¹** persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

2,251,086¹ persons have arrived to Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

34,248¹ persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

STORY

Crisis-affected people coming from Ukraine might be exposed to labour exploitation or related trafficking due to their vulnerable situations. IOM Hungary has extensive knowledge of this risk, thanks to the expertise matured by Counter-Trafficking Team over the previous years. In this regard, last week IOM co-led a workshop, together with UNHCR and Menedék Association, on the available tools to better identify and protect at-risk refugees from Ukraine in Hungary.

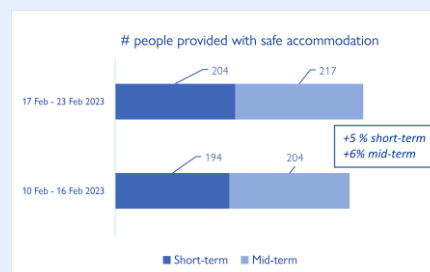

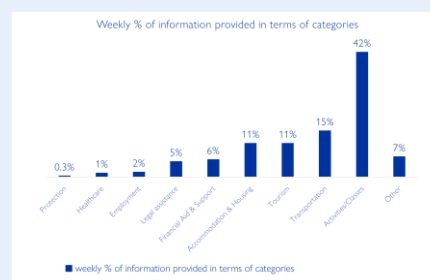
Accommodation
