

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

As of today, it is estimated that over **19,505,596¹** persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

2,350,357¹ persons have arrived to Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

34,248¹ persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

The foreseen activities under the project will focus on providing shelter, distributing food and hygiene activities, establishing food banks, and providing child protection through the development of childcare facilities.

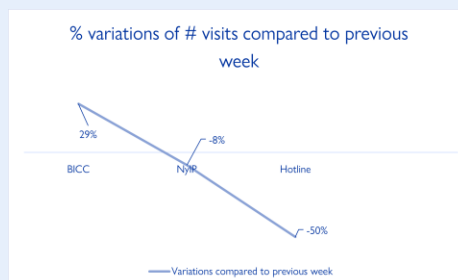
