

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

As of today, it is estimated that over **19,729,989¹** persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

2,384,203¹ persons have arrived to Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

34,248¹ persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

STORY

IOM Hungary extensively acknowledges the importance of spurring education involving children displaced by the war in Ukraine. Among the various activities supported in this regard, IOM successfully organized a book fair in Budapest Helps! Info and Community Center last week. The event led to the delivery of hundreds of Ukrainian scholastic books to several children accompanied by their families.

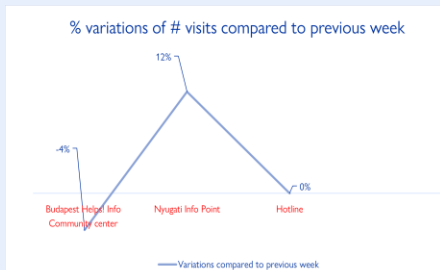
