

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

As of today, it is estimated that over **19,740,849¹** persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

2,414,914¹ persons have arrived in Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

34,248¹ persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

Among the invaluable services provided by IOM, the interpretation and translation services have already supported nearly 500 people in 2023 in their interactions with public authorities or healthcare providers, along with the translation of numerous documents. *“Although it is hard to see people in vulnerable situations, it is unquestionably a great joy to be able to assist them with the work we do”,* said one of IOM’s interpreters. 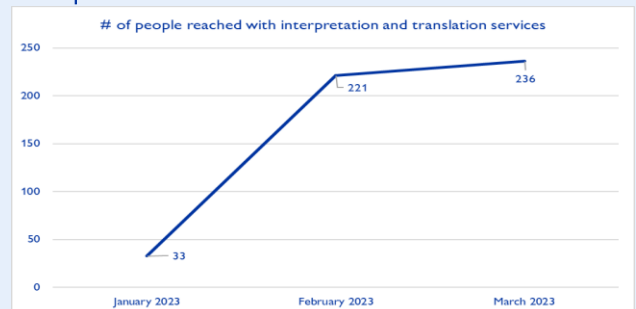
