# **IOM HUNGARY / UKRAINE RESPONSE**

MIGRANT PROTECTION AND ASSISTANCE WEEKLY SNAPSHOT: 11 November 2022

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

To this moment, it is estimated that over 15,107,523<sup>1</sup> persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

1,709,665<sup>1</sup> persons have arrived to Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

31,2901 persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

## **STORY**

IOM Hungary has been working to advocate for counter-trafficking measures as part of the Ukraine crisis response. IOM protection and countertrafficking (CT) specialists are organising a series of counter-trafficking workshops in partnership with UNHCR and stakeholders. The first workshop session was successful, and included discussions around best practices for identification and referrals of children at risk within the Ukrainian crisis response.
