

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

To this moment, it is estimated that over **14,853,082¹** persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

1,670,028¹ persons have arrived to Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

31,290¹ persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

“Hungarian language is a very special one, it’s a real challenge to learn it and teach it” - said Krisztina, a logopaedist and language tutor who holds language classes for both children and their parents daily. IOM Hungary collaborates with Unity Association, a local Ukrainian cultural heritage NGO, to provide education and development activities for Ukrainians in Hungary. During the day, Krisztina holds two to four classes for children, while in the evenings she conducts language courses for adults.






Accommodation

Since the beginning of the war, shelter provision has been the most requested support from crisis-affected people.

As of 4 November 2022:

1,250 people were provided with short-term accommodation
409 people were provided with mid-long-term accommodation
