Terms of Reference

Introduction
The project aims to address the urgent needs of displaced individuals fleeing Ukraine due to the ongoing conflict, focusing on saving lives, protecting vulnerable populations, and driving sustainable solutions for displacement.
Background
The war following the invasion of Ukraine by Russia has triggered a major human mobility crisis in Europe. IOM Hungary is committed to providing assistance and resources to displaced individuals, focusing on protection, education, healthcare, mental health, and socio-economic inclusion with the support of various donors.
Objectives

Proposed interventions
<p>IOM Hungary maintains a broad scope for potential activities that align with operational needs and future projects. Overarching Outcomes:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Enhanced humanitarian assistance and access to basic needs, and protection of the most vulnerable - Socioeconomic inclusion and services needed for resilience and self-sufficiency of displaced populations
Expected results
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Vulnerable populations, including Third Country Nationals (TCNs), have improved access to basic needs such as shelter, multipurpose cash, health, and sanitation services, enhancing their protection and well-being. - Displaced populations achieve greater self-sufficiency through enhanced access to education, employment opportunities, and community support etc., fostering their socioeconomic inclusion and resilience.
Impact
Long-term effects include improved well-being, socio-economic inclusion, and resilience among displaced populations, contributing to sustainable solutions for displacement.
Partnerships and collaboration
Collaboration with governmental agencies, NGOs, and civil society organizations registered in Hungary, working on a non-commercial basis to implement project activities and share responsibilities.
Proposed timeline:
The application process for the Prequalification Call for Expression of Interest (CEI) begins on 19.06.2024, with a deadline for submission on 19.07.2024. Results will be notified within six weeks after the application deadline, and selected projects will start upon donor confirmation and IOM priorities, with implementation dates to be determined.
Qualification and experience
Partners should have experience in humanitarian assistance, protection, healthcare, education, and livelihoods support for refugee and migrant populations. Special consideration will be given to project proposals that focus on vulnerable populations, including but not limited to Roma and LGBTIQ+ communities, and consider intersectionality. Preference will be given to projects that demonstrate the ability to navigate local bureaucracy and collaborate with national or local authorities and government agencies. Additionally, projects with geographic coverage outside of the capital will be favored. Projects that employ innovative methods to address the needs of beneficiaries and use a participatory approach to actively engage with the affected populations will also be prioritized. Proposals from grassroots or community-based entities with active relationships with the affected communities are especially encouraged.
Submission of the project proposal
Project proposals should be submitted by eligible organizations by 19.07.2024 at International Organization for Migration (or Nemzetközi Migrációs Szervezet); 2 Radnóti Miklós utca, Budapest, 1137 Hungary.
