

On 24 February 2022, the Russian Federation launched a broad military invasion in Ukraine, which has contributed to significant internal displacement and cross-border movements.

To this moment, it is estimated that over **12,660,508¹** persons have been forcibly displaced into neighboring countries, with still more projected to move out of the country.

1,381,738¹ persons have arrived to Hungary across the Hungarian-Ukrainian border.

29,170¹ persons applied for the temporary protection status in Hungary.

STORY

This week, IOM Hungary established a Feedback Mechanism to be used at the active shelters and Info Points run by the organization. In order for humanitarian response activity to be relevant and effective, it must engage with and listen to target populations. The feedback boxes will serve this purpose by providing a tool that seeks to improve IOM assistance delivery through the active participation of beneficiaries.

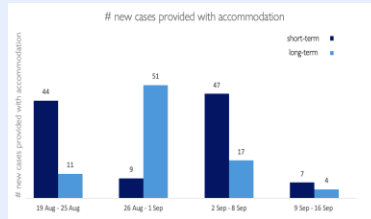

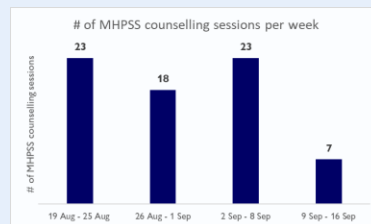
Accommodation

IOM Hungary continues to receive an increased number of accommodation requests from people arriving from Ukraine.

As of 16 September 2022:

959 people were provided with short-term accommodation

340 people were provided with mid-long-term accommodation
